From the Superintendent's Desk

All parents/guardians will again, need to provide verification of residency in the Paw Paw School District #271. Proof for residents will include a combination of a total of 3 documents if you already attend Paw Paw Schools and a total of 4 documents if you are new to our District. One of these documents has to be a current Drivers License or State I.D. with a current address. If you are living with someone, the person with whom you are living will have to provide proof of residency as well as other documents. A list is included in this School Bell. If you do not provide the necessary proof of residency at the August registration, your child's registration will be delayed considerably.

Mark your calendars! Registration for the 2017-18 school year will be held on Wednesday, August 2, 2017 from 1:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. and Thursday, August 3, 2017 from 1:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. in the high school office.

From the Nurse:

We will need the following forms:

Kindergarten students: school physical, eye doctor form, dental form*

2nd grade students - dental form*

6th grade: school physical (will cover the sports physical) dental form*

9th grade: school physical* (will cover the sports physical)

Sport physicals for all students who are going out for sports at Paw Paw Jr./Sr. High School is required.

*All students are eligible to take advantage of the mobile dentist to be held this fall to fulfill the requirements for a dental exam for K, 2nd, and 6th grade or you may go to your family dentist.

****REMEMBER:** students entering 6th and 12th grade will need to show proof of recent meningococcal conjugate vaccination, MCV, (meningitis vaccination); 6th grade dose is to be on or after 11 years of age; 12th grade is 2nd dose unless the first dose was after 16 years of age.

New Students
Re-enrolling Students after Withdrawal
Fall Registration

In order for a parent, guardian, or person seeking to enroll/register a student into Paw Paw Schools for the first time, or after a child is withdrawn and wishes to re-enroll or for registration of returning families at the beginning of the year, the following documentation from each section is required to verify residence, identity, and full -time residency in the school district:

Category 1 - All families - ONE Document from the following (Verification Residence is in the District):

- * Most recent property tax bill and proof of payment (cancelled check or stub from tax form indicating payment)
- * Mortgage papers with parent/guardian's name listed as homeowner
- * Signed and dated lease and proof of last month's payment (cancelled check or verification letter from landlord)
- * Housing letter (military personnel)
- * Letter of residence from landlord in lieu of lease (form available from school)
- * Letter of residence to be used when the person seeking to enroll a student is living with a district resident that is not a parent/guardian (form available from school)

AND FROM THE LISTS BELOW

Category 2 - All families - (Verification of Identity and Residency in the District)

- * Residents with a valid Illinois Driver's License must present a license that confirms the address being used for residency in the district. When presented, the license will qualify as a needed in Category 3.

Category 3 - Verification of Residency in the District

Returning Families: Students/Families returning in the Fall to start the first day of school after completing the previous spring semester only need to provide ONE of the following showing an address in district including the name of the person enrolling the student.

New Families: Families new to the district, or returning after withdrawing, need to provide TWO of the following documents showing the address in district, including the name of the person enrolling the student.

- * Illinois Driver's License
- * State of Illinois Identification Card
- * Vehicle registration
- * Voter registration
- * Unexpired Illinois DNR hunting/fishing license
- * Most recent cable, satellite, or credit card bill
- * Current public aid card
- * Current homeowner's/renter's/vehicle insurance policy and verification premium has been paid
- * Most recent gas, electric, and/or water bill
- * Mail received at new residence

Legal custody is not required to enroll a student. A person seeking to enroll a student who is not the legal guardian of the child will need to supply legal documentation and/or complete district forms to determine that the student legally resides in the district, and therefore not required to be charged tuition to attend Paw Paw School District #271. This process also will protect the safety of a minor when custody is of concern. The school district will require documentation to be completed if a person seeking to enroll a student is not the adoptive parent, legal guardian, or designated custodial parent of a child as the result of a divorce, separation or action taken by a court of law or legal agency. Once residency has been verified enrollment into classes will then begin.

FEEES FOR THE 2017-18 SCHOOL

Book rental fees:

- \$55.00 for Kindergarten students
- \$75.00 for students in grades 1-12

These charges include a computer lab usage fee for grades K-12 and assignment book fee charges for grades 3-12. Locks for physical education lockers, for grades 5-12, will be available for rent for \$2.00. There will be lab fees of \$27.00 for students enrolled in Art, Computer, Chemistry, Biology II, and Ag Courses. Students attending IVVC the fee is \$200.00, plus students attending Illinois Valley Vocational Center will be assessed program fees by IVVC.

For those students participating in Drivers Education, there will be a \$250.00 fee. High School Band instrument rental, for school owned instruments, will be \$55.00 per year. The student will be held responsible for damage done to the instrument or case during the rental period.

PE uniforms for grades 6-12 are \$12.00 for shirt and \$10.00 for shorts

Paw Paw College Course Book/Materials fee - \$30.00 per course.

Hot Lunch prices: Please note, lunch prices were increased this school year:

- **Grades K thru 6 - \$2.25**
- **Grades 7 thru 12 - \$2.50**
- **Adults—\$2.75**

- Milk .35

Extra cartons of milk will be available for 35¢ each. Free and reduced price lunch applications will be available during registration. Students, who received free or reduced price lunches last year, will be eligible for the same until September 29th, 2017. **After that, if you did not reapply for benefits, your students will be charged for any hot lunch that they take.**

* School time accident insurance is free for all students. It is free for students during school time and those involved in extra-curricular activities. For anyone wanting 24 hour coverage, including extended dental, that is also offered. Pamphlets on this student accident insurance coverage, with current prices, will be available at registration.

* Students who participate in athletics will pay a \$35.00 per sport equipment fee. Those participating in athletics must also submit a parent permission form along with a completed physical examination form and they must be turned in to the school office before the first practice.

* Students entering school for the first time and those entering sixth and ninth grades must have physical examinations and immunizations prior to the first day of school. Failure to have the required physical and immunizations can result in the students not being admitted to school. Transfers, from other Illinois school districts at any grade level, must have their health records forwarded from their prior school. Transfer students from out-of-state schools must have a physical examination.

Also, the State of Illinois has mandated that all students in grades Kindergarten, second, and sixth must have a dental exam prior to May 15th of each school year.

PARENTS, PLEASE NOTE . . .

Parents, please make sure that female and male athletes planning to go out for sports for the 2017-18 school year receive their physicals NOW! Each sport season we have students attempting to get appointments, with their physicians, at the last moment and are disappointed when they are not able to do so.

Students will NOT be allowed to participate in practices until physicals, participation forms and sports fees have been turned in and/or paid to the school. High school volleyball and soccer will begin on Wednesday, August 9th. Contact your coaches for times.

VISION AND HEARING SCREENING

All children entering Kindergarten must show proof that they have had a complete eye exam by an optometrist or an ophthalmologist before the first day of school. At the beginning of the school year, we will be conducting vision and hearing screenings for first through fifth graders and eighth graders.

The school vision test screens for sharpness of vision, farsightedness and muscle balance. If your child does not pass the initial screening, a rescreening will be given to double check the screening results. If your child does not pass the second screening, you will be notified and asked to take your child to an eye doctor for a professional eye exam.

In the hearing screening, several sounds are used to test your child's hearing. If your child did not hear all of the sounds, your child will be retested. Not all children who fail the screening tests have a hearing loss. If your child has a suspected hearing loss, you will be advised to take your child to a doctor.

Vision screening is not a substitute for a complete eye and vision examination by an eye doctor. Your child is not required to undergo the vision screening if we have on file a completed and signed form from an optometrist or ophthalmologist indicating that an examination has been administered within the previous 12 months.

MOBILE DENTIST

THIS FALL, Whiteside County Health Department mobile dental clinic will be coming to Paw Paw School to give dental exams to children whose parents choose to take advantage of this opportunity. This service is available to all children ages 3 -14. The mobile dentists team consists of a dentist, hygienist and dental assistant, who provide dental examinations, cleanings, fluoride treatment and sealants (if necessary) for your child. Whiteside County Health Department is a provider for Medicaid/Kid Care and most insurances. It offers grants to children in need who don't have dental insurance or Medicaid/All Kids. It also has a subsidized fee of \$40 for those not qualifying for a grant.

The State of Illinois has mandated that all students in kindergarten, second and sixth grade must have a dental examination for this school year between May 16, 2016 and May 16, 2017. This will meet that requirement. Watch for your child to bring home an orange permission slip for the mobile dentists. This is a wonderful opportunity to get them preventive dental care in a very easy way.

Kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grade students may also fulfill the state requirement at a dentist of their choice.

National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs

Paw Paw CUSD #271 today announced its policy for free and reduced-price lunch, for those students unable to pay the full price for meals under the National School Lunch Programs. The following household size and income criteria will be used for determining eligibility.

Children from households that meet Federal guidelines are eligible for free or reduced-price meal services. **Complete one application per household for all children that attend the same school district.**

All meals served must meet the U. S. Department of Agriculture meal requirements. However, if a child has been determined by a doctor to have a disability and the disability would prevent the child from eating the regular school meal, this school will make substitutions prescribed by the doctor. If a substitution is needed, there will be no extra charge for the meal. If you believe your child needs substitutions because of a disability, please contact the school for further information.

Application forms are available to all homes with a letter for parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced-price meal services, households must complete the application as soon as possible, sign it, and return it to the school. Additional copies of the application form are available in the principal's office in each school. Households should answer all applicable questions on the form. An application which does not contain all the required information cannot be processed and approved by the school. Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) participants **may** be eligible for free/reduced-price meals and are encouraged to complete an application for meal benefits.

The required information is as follows:

SNAP/TANF HOUSEHOLDS: If the school provided you a letter that stated your child(ren) is eligible for free meals via the direct certification process, **you do not have to complete this application to receive meal benefits.** Households that currently receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) for their child(ren), only have to list the child(ren)'s name and SNAP or TANF case number and sign the application. **Applications listing LINK card numbers cannot be used for free or reduced-price meals.**

ALL OTHER HOUSEHOLDS: If a household's income is at or below the level shown on the income scale, children are eligible for either free or reduced-price meal services. Households must provide the following information: (1) the names of all household members; (2) the social security number of the adult household member signing the application, or indicate if the adult does not have a social security number; (3) the amount of income each household member received last month, how frequently it is paid, and where it came from (wages, child support, etc.); and (4) the signature of an adult household member.

The information on the application may be checked by school or other officials at any time during the school year.

Households may apply for benefits at any time during the school year. Households that are not eligible now but have a decrease in household income, an increase in household size, or a household member becomes unemployed, should fill out an application at that time. Homeless, migrant, runaway youth, Head Start and foster care children are categorically eligible for free meals. Please follow instructions and return form to school.

Households that do not agree with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss it with the school. Households also have the right to a fair hearing. This can be done by calling or writing the following official:
